

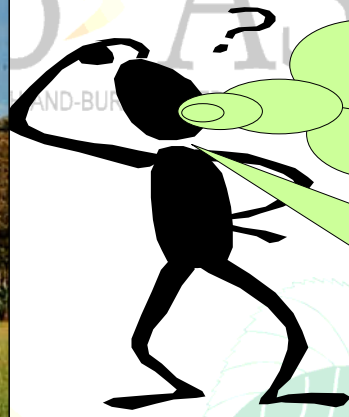

Repong Damar forest garden management in Pesisir Barat Lampung Barat

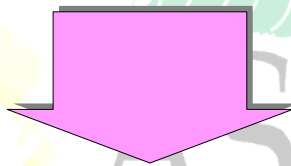


Policy Question:

How to manage forest resources where long-established communities have their agroforests on land claimed as State Forest lands?

Objective:

Develop, test and improve models for reaching consensus between the forest service and local communities regarding community-based forest resources.

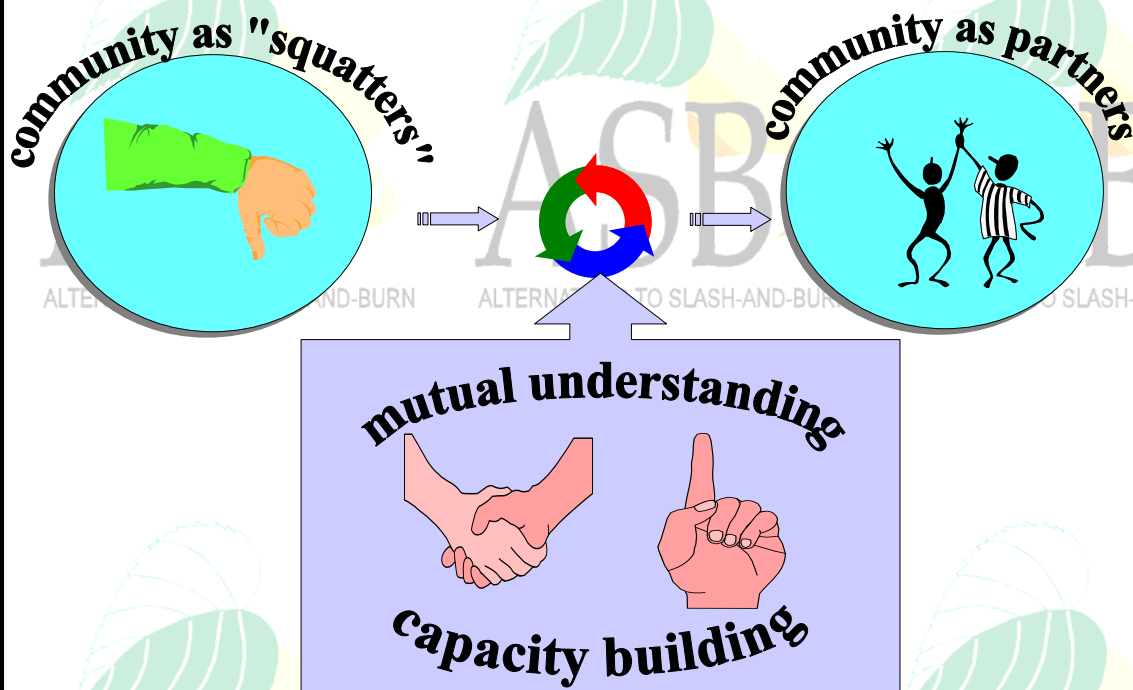


Methods: Participative, process-oriented research for policy and institutional development involving the community and the forest department, in collaboration with several NGOs, a university and research institutions.

Participatory planning of natural resource management.



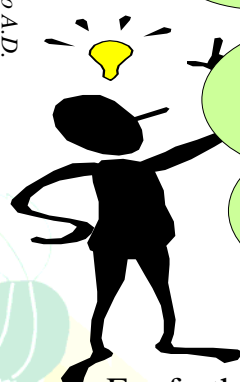
